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


In 2012, they completed the four year film program at Simon Fraser University. They have since directed both in both theatre and film. Their 2014 stage version of HAMLET featured the first female Hamlet in Canada. In 2015, their short film THE MARY ALICE BRANDON FILE (a TWILIGHT prequel), was the winner of the "New Voices of the Twilight Saga" competition hosted by Lionsgate, Facebook, and Women in Film LA. For their work on that film, the twins were recognized by Women in Film LA at the Crystal & Lucy Awards. and then by Women in Film & TV Vancouver with a Spotlight Award. In 2018, their short film CC was a Crazv8s winner. After completion, it played in numerous festivals worldwide and won many awards before ultimately finding a home on CBC Gem (and DUST internationally). Their most recent short film. ALIEN: ORE was made with 20th Century Fox and Tongal in celebration of the 40th anniversary of ALIEN (1979). The sisters just directed their first episode of TV on CW's TWO SENTENCE HORROR STORIES

Hayashi Studio follows the diverse lives that came to a small town on Vancouver Island in the 1900's and Senjiro Hayashi, the Japanese photographer who took their photos. Hayashi used his lens to document every race, class and gender. During internment many of his photos disappear, some hidden in family attics, others used to make a greenhouse. Almost a century later the photos were found and exhibited, showcasing a piece of Pacific Northwest History rarely seen, that of the diverse and racialized.



WATERSHED Dir. Maxime Beauchamp // 14 min

While scavenging around an empty city after a water-borne virus has killed off most of the Earth's population, a lone survivor finds a sliver of hope when she encounters a young Mandarin girl who may be able to chemically manufacture clean water.



WHAT ABOUT OUR FUTURE?

Dir. Jaime Leigh Gianopoulos // 25 min

In 2019, the "Sustainabiliteens" from Vancouver mobilized more than 150,000 people to march against climate catastophe. The film gives insights into the teenagers' everyday life which is determined not only by school, friends and families, but also by the climate justice and activism. Taking things into their own hands gives them strength: "We are unstoppable, another world is possible."



PLUGGED IN Dir. Kathryn Bons // 12 min

After receiving the latest companion android as a gift, reclusive Ashaya must choose between a flawed human relationship and a customizable machine one.



BLEED WITH ME Dir. Varsha Gill // 6 min

Bleed With Me showcases the perspectives of sixteen people from the Greater Vancouver region of different ages, genders, ethnicities, abilities, and socioeconomic classes, on menstruation. Bleed With Me highlights that menstruation is experienced subjectively, impacts people's lives deeply, and needs to be destigmatized. This film challenges menstrual stigma by encouraging open, honest, and inclusive conversations about menstruation.

Rachel Talalay Panelist

Rachel Talalay's eclectic career spans three decades of directing and producing. She recently completed a family monster film, A Babysitters Guide To Monster Hunting, which will air on Netflix in October. Over the past 5 years she has directed for seven episodes of DoctorWho, the opening film of Series IV of the acclaimed Sherlock, and episodes of American television including American Gods, Marvel's Iron Fist, DC's Doom Patrol, Riverdale, Sabrina, SuperGirl, Legends of Tomorrow, and The Flash.

In 2020 she also executive-produced and co-wrote an independent feature, An Introvert's Guide To High School, which won the Best Innovation Feature and Best Neo Style Feature at the Two Roads International Film Festival. It will be premiering in December.

In between the TV episodes, she directed the film based on StevieCameron's award-winning novel "On the Farm". Playing at more thana dozen festivals, it won Best Narrative Feature at The Seattle SocialJustice Film Festival and Best Filmmaking at LA Skins Festival. Her eclectic resume includes directing Tank Girl, Freddy's Dead(Nightmare on Elm Street 6), Ghost In The Machine, Wind in theWillows, award-winning mini-series (Terminal City, Durham Countyand Dice) and more than 75 hours of television in the US, UK and Canada from Ally McBeal to Without a Trace, Randall & Hopkirk (Deceased) to Touching Evil.

Her producing history is equally varied: from Hairspray (the original) and Cry Baby to the Nightmare on Elm Street franchise (parts 3 and 4) to The Borrowers.

Talalay is an active advocate for Diversity and Gender Equality.#DiverseVoicesMatter. She co-founded The Full Flood Foundation which supports Indigenous women and children with missing or murdered family members.

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
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
